environment	The natural world in which people, animals and plants live.
focus	To give your attention.
identify	To recognise something and explain a little more.
individual	A single member of a class of things. It could be a person or a thing.
objective	Something that you are trying to achieve.
participate	To take part and become involved in an activity.
positive	If something is good or useful.
previous	Something that has happened before what you are talking about.
respond	To give a spoken or written answer.
sequence	Having something in an order. It could be numbers, patterns or events in a story.
similar	Like something else but not exactly the same.
text	A piece of writing.
tradition	A way of doing something that has existed for a long time.

adapt	To change something to make it suitable.
analyse	To examine something in order to understand and explain it better.
appropriate	Something that is acceptable.
approximate	Almost correct or accurate.
communicate	To exchange or share information like news, ideas and feelings.
contribute	To give something to help achieve or provide something.
cooperate	To work together to achieve something.
culture	The beliefs and way of life of a group of people.
distribute	To share something between a number of people.
draft	A written version of something that is not finished yet.
ensure	To make sure that something happens.
estimate	To form an idea without being exact.
evaluate	To reach an opinion after thinking about it carefully.
explicit	To make it clear and easy to understand.
inspect	To look closely and check that it is how it should be.
interact	To communicate with someone or to see how two things effect each other.
paragraph	Several sentences in a piece of writing that are about the same subject.
predict	To say or have a good guess that something is going to happen in the future.
publish	To produce a piece of writing that is going to be seen by the public.

relevant	Closely connected with the subject that you are discussing or the situation that you are in.
research	A careful study of a subject to discover new facts or information.
resource	A supply of something eg food. Something that can be used to provide information eg book.
significant	Having particular meaning. Important enough to be noticed.
structure	The way something is connected, arranged or organised. It could also be something that is made of several parts.
unique	The only one of its kind. Very special or unusual.
